Pammel Creek Trout Stream Restoration

Project Goal: Restore a section of Pammel Creek flowing through the Community Trail Farm to improve water quality, enhance habitat, and create a healthier, more resilient ecosystem.


This project brings new life to the creek while supporting long-term conservation, education, and outdoor access. This project is fully funded with construction anticipated for summer of 2026.

In partnership with Coulee Region Trout Unlimited and the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), a detailed restoration plan has been developed and is moving toward implementation.

Work planned includes:

- Stream bank stabilization and reshaping to prevent erosion
- Regrading the channel to restore natural flow patterns
- Enhanced trout habitat features, including in-stream structures and cover
- Flood mitigation improvements to protect sensitive areas

The engineering plans include elements like rock stabilization, habitat structures, and natural bank shaping techniques designed to mimic how healthy streams function.



This restoration will:

- Improve water quality and reduce sediment runoff
- Create stronger, more sustainable trout habitat
- Reduce flooding impacts on surrounding land
- Provide hands-on opportunities for education and conservation
- Enhance the natural beauty and experience of the Community Trail Farm
